Almost every day she would walk through the house to make sure everything was all right, no leaks or wind damage. This meant going up a very steep staircase to the second floor which was not for the faint of heart (as some of you all may know) , but she was determined to overlook nothing. And so the house remains intact, the lawns properly cut, and all fences standing. Whenever the repair people came she was there on the spot. I told them she was my manager and they were to do what she said. I could not have kept the house, which I love, without her, and when I would come down to TR for various reasons, there was famous "our lunch" with Mary and Joe, always the same Southern food - roast beef, mac and cheese, green beans, coleslaw and of course cornbread! Delicious! I would bring pictures on the iPod of my most recent trips (Seattle, Canada , New Hampshire, the Pacific Coast for example) and sit between Mary and Joe at the kitchen table to look at each one.

When as soon as I got to Momma's house on the current trip Mary would come right over to hear the latest, and we laughed a lot .Whenever I left to go back home to NC, I was to stop over and give her a list of things to take care of at the house and say good bye to her and Joe. Then she would stand at their front door and wave goodbye having admonished me not to forget to call when i got home safely.I therefore remember clearly the last time i saw her...standing at the front door and smiling . I am forever grateful to all the help she gave me (although I often dreaded when the phone rang in Durham from TR because it meant something had happened at Momma's house that had to be repaired.) But I never had to worry because she was always alert to the smallest problem and always on the case! And as I have told everyone, I could not have kept the house all these years without her.

I will miss her terribly and coming to Momma's house will never be the same .
