June 5, 1908 - May 5, 2010

Dolores Klober MacNees, “The Pink Lady” of Travelers Rest, passed away at The Woodlands at Furman on May 5, 2010. Dolores was born June 5, 1908 in St. Paul, MN, to the late Otto and Bessie Klober. She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, Colonel Frank J. MacNees, daughter and son-in-law, Nancy and Tom Conway, son-in-law, David Pritchard-Barrett, brother, Roger Klober, and great-grand daughter, Imogene Pritchard-Barrett. She is survived by daughter, Joan Pritchard-Barrett, four grandchildren, and nine great-grandchildren in England. Survivors in Travelers Rest are granddaughters, Cynthia (Allen) Clark, Heather (Steve) Rochester, and two great-grandchildren. Survivors in Minnesota are sister, Shirley Thom of Roseville, and many nieces and nephews.

After selecting the site for and serving as base commander at Donaldson Air Force Base, Colonel and Mrs. MacNees eventually retired in Travelers Rest in 1962 where Dolores enjoyed gardening and helping her husband raise Whiteface Hereford cattle and Golden Retrievers. She was a long-time member of Trinity Presbyterian Church (she received the Presbyterian Women Lifetime Membership Award on her 100th birthday), the Travelers Rest Garden Club, and Senior Action.

The family will receive friends from 10 until 11 Saturday morning at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Travelers Rest. Funeral services will be at 11 Saturday

morning at Trinity Presbyterian Church with entombment to follow at Greenville Memorial Gardens.
