Donald Kay, 79, of 1 W. Scenic Drive, Travelers Rest, husband of Jimmie Anglin Kay, went home to be with the Lord on September 30th, 2011.

Born on March 7th, 1932, in Cowpens, SC, he was the son of the late Clyde Leslie and Nellie Collins Kay. Mr. Kay was a former deacon and Sunday school teacher of the First Baptist Church of Travelers Rest. He graduated from MUSC School of Pharmacy where he was the class president in 1954. He owned and operated People's Drug Store on Main Street in Travelers Rest from 1958 until his retirement in 1981. A fond memory of Mr. Kay was of the years he played football for Blacksburg High School, where he was inducted into their Football Hall of Fame.

Mr. Kay was very proud of his family. In addition to his wife Jimmie, of 59 years, he is also survived by 3 daughters, Libby (Pat) Cunningham, Lori (Cesar) Lopez and Lisa (Thomas) Martin; 8 grandchildren, Katy Cunningham Owen, Emily Cunningham Dalton, Alex Lopez, Leslie Lopez Tiller, Elizabeth Martin, Jaime Cunningham, Zack Lopez, and Madeline Martin; 3 great grandchildren, Makayla Tiller, A.J.
