Henry Earl McCarrell, 90, of 2220 Hwy. 414, passed away Sunday, April 12, 2009 at Richard B. Campbell Veterans Center.

Born in Greenville County, he was a son of the late Ernest and Ida Southern McCarrell. Mr. McCarrell was a US Air Force Veteran of World War II, having flown over 39 missions as a tail gunner in a B-25.
