Unbeknownst to most she was also a prolific poet, many of her poems hidden and stashed away only to be found later, holding the deepest sincerities and truths residing in her beautiful heart.

She was also an excellent cook and could create the most amazing meals, her signature spaghetti sauce and country cooking being some of the best!

One of her most endearing traits was her unconditional love and concern for animals. Her beloved dog Pepper was the light of her life for many years and her precious kitty Lucky stole her heart in her later years. But she loved and adored all animals. She loved her daughters dogs as if they were her own grandchildren. And they loved her equally in return. Even in her last moments, right to the end, being present and holding a steadfast loyalty to her at her bedside.
