Jimmie Anglin Kay, 81, formerly of W. Scenic Drive, Travelers Rest, wife of the late Donald Kay, went home to be with the Lord on October 14, 2013.

Born on October 12th, 1932 in Gainesville, GA, she was the daughter of the late Jim and Mary Daniel Anglin. She graduated from Blacksburg High School in 1950 and continued her education in Spartanburg by becoming a registered X-Ray Technician. She married her high school sweet heart in 1952 and moved with him to Charleston where they worked as he completed his education. They moved to Travelers Rest in 1955. For many years Mrs. Kay helped her husband in the family business, Peoples Drug Store, where she served as bookkeeper or wherever she was needed.

Mrs. Kay and her husband were members of Travelers Rest First Baptist Church for over fifty years. At times during those years she was a Girls' Auxiliary leader, choir member, and finance committee member. She was also active in the community as a former Garden Club and Study Club Member.

Mrs. Kay was proud of her family. She and her husband were married 59 years until his death. She was an exceptional "from scratch" cook who had a massive cookbook collection. She was affectionately referred to by her family as "the best cook in town".
