Thank you brother for all the music made and stages slayed, those were and always will be remembered as some of the best times of my life. "We were young, we had momentum, we were winning!!" It may take me a bit to get it completed but I have some shows recorded on VHS I'm converting to DVD, thought maybe the kids could use for a tribute page on social media or to just have and see Justin when he was just a kid himself.
