“*Dear Landrum Family - I want to take a minute to tell you what your mother meant to me. I was 16 when we met, and had just started going out with Robert Wade Landrum. I was not from a Christian home and had just read the New Testament for the first time. Margory (Marge) Landrum was the first Christian lady that I ever had the privilege to come to know. She opened up her home to me when I was a runaway. I stayed with her two weeks, as I recall. She was so gentle in speech. She and her husband had a warm and inviting home, and her children were mostly my age, so I felt like I got a glimpse of what it would be like to grow up in a Christian home. Television was not the center of family life - the supper table was. I never saw her say an ugly word about anybody. I never saw her raise her voice in anger. I am sure she must have done these things, but I never saw it. She never questioned me or made me feel like she was judging me, although I deserved it. She shared some of her songs with me, that she wrote and played on the piano and sang. She introduced me to the spirit-filled charismatic church, which she loved. She loved to worship. She gave me gentle advice and put her arms around me more than once. Later, when Wade and I divorced, she still came to visit me with her husband, Bob. He had such a sense of humor, and she, for being a soft-spoken woman, had a loud and hearty laugh which you could hear from down the hall, and say to yourself, "Is that Marge??!" It always made me smile to hear her laugh. She must have been an excellent nurse because she had such a warmth about her and a spirit-filled glow. She truly knew how to love. Most of all, she loved the Lord Jesus Christ. She put him first in her life and in her home. She told me the story of how she and Bob had just been saved when Wade was born, and they had been unchurched and untaught before then. Maybe that is why she never judged me harshly. And she loved all her children immensely, unconditionally. I wanted her to be my Mom. I wanted to have that upbringing. Or at least to bring up my children in such a home. She taught me to speak a little softer. To love a little broader. To not judge too quickly and to forgive easily.*

I will never forget her smile, which was semi-constant. She came from being a non-Christian to being Christ-filled, and what a beautiful, spiritual, gentle soul she was. She wrote the song "Tender Shepherd," which she showed me. It was just like her to write such a song. I knew I could trust Christ because I saw that SHE did, wholeheartedly.

I know she was imperfect and you all probably knew that better than I, because I never saw a bad side of her. I knew her for 7 or 8 years as my mother-in-law or former MIL. Either way, she was always so kind to me. I am so very thankful for the impact her true Christianity had on my early Christian experience. And although I am heartbroken to hear of her passing and her pain, I know it's all good now! I know she is happy, reunited with her son, Wade, and is waiting for us all as she stands in the presence of the Love of her life, Jesus Christ.

As a new Christian and 16-year old spoiled girl, I could have gone back to the world easily. She set an example that made me want more of what she had. I can't wait to see her again and thank her in person. It is a privilege to have known her love in my life.
