Otis Delee Moore, 77, passed away on September 11, 2012 after an extended illness.

Born in Greenville County on June 5, 1935, he was the son of the late Eugene Gordon and Arie Bishop Moore. He served in the US Army for 2 years before joining the Air Force. He was in Fire Protection most of his Air Force career, performing all functions including the Base Fire Chief at Moran AFB, Spain 1971-1974. After retiring from the Air Force in 1975, he worked 18 years for Michelin Tire Corporation in Greenville and Spartanburg. He retired from Michelin Tire Corporation in 1993.
