Stella R. Crawford, of Greenville, South Carolina, wife of Walter Crawford, Jr., died on Saturday, October 17, 2015. A Memorial Mass will be 9:00 a.m. Friday, October 30th, at The Monastery Of St. Clare, followed by a private burial in Mountain View Memorial Park, Travelers Rest, SC.

She was born in Wilmington, Delaware, to the late Matteo Rodolico and Adelina Lamanna Rodolico. She was employed by Bank of Delaware as an Administrative Assistant and Legal Secretary. She earned a certificate from the American Institute of Banking and was commissioned as a Notary Public for the State of Delaware. After moving to Florida in 1985, she was graduated Summa Cum Laude in 1990 from Gulf Coast Community College where she earned an Associate in Arts degree. She was a member of the National Honorary Society, Phi Theta Kappa, and was elected to "Who's Who Among Students in American Junior Colleges." Mrs. Crawford attended Florida State University, was a participant in the Education Encore program for Life-Long Learning, and was a member of the Women's Auxiliary of the Panama Country Club, Lynn Haven Florida. After moving to Greenville, South Carolina in 2006, she was a participant in the Furman University FULIR program, a part of Furman's Division of Continuing Education.
