“ My big brother Brent (when I was learning to speak as a child I called him Frent) was a man with a lot of drive and ambition. Brent had an easy going personality and was well liked. He loved to be outdoors, nature and had a fascination for wild animals. At different times he raised a wild baby pig, a pet squirrel and a pet raccoon named Meiko. Growing up one of his favorite TV shows was Little House on the Prarie. His first full-time job was with T&S Brass and not long after he started he was promoted to being in charge of the tubing department a job he held for 38 years. He was very well respected by the company and coworkers and was appreciative of everything T&S Brass did for him. After he started at T&S Brass It did not take long for Brent to save enough money to buy 2&1/2 acres of land with a beautiful view of Glassy Mountain. Then he bought a D4 Caterpillar bulldozer he named "Cubby" and cleared the trees off his land. He moved a single-wide house trailer on the land and while living there with his wife proceeded to build a 2 story 3,000 sq ft colonial home for his family. He hired out some things but did most of the work himself nailing up framing, laying brick and roofing the house. While being a husband and a father, working full time and building the house he made the acquisition of an International dump truck he named "Black Mack" and worked it part time hauling and doing grading work with his bulldozer. As Brent aged, he could not keep the same pace as when he was young and his life revolved more around being a father to his beloved son Brandon. Six months before he died he was blessed with a beautiful grandson named Liam. Brent was baptized into the Church of Christ at the age of 16 and faithfully attended church all his life. His first church was Augusta Road Church of Christ then Greer Church of Christ and finale was Taylors Church of Christ. Lord willing brother I will see you again and maybe we can sit on a cloud as the sunsets and watch Glassy Mountain turn purple.
